- Strong analytical and writing skills.
- Demonstrated commitment to civil rights and social justice.

The base salary for this role will be commensurate with litigation experience. The salary scale starts \$140,000 (gross) for at least 5 years of civil litigation experience and ends at \$200,000 (gross) for 10 years or more. This role is eligible for an annual bonus.
